IMPORTANT SUMMER TAX INFORMATION

Payment can be made by mail, in person or in the drop box outside of the Victor Township Hall. You are encouraged to pay your property taxes by mail; however, the **postmark dates DO NOT serve as payment dates.** Payments must be in the office by 5:00 p.m. on the due date or penalty and interest will be charged. If you decide to pay in person the office is open Monday through Friday 1:00 to 4:30. Make checks payable to Victor Township Treasurer.

If you are paying with cash please have exact change. We do not keep cash on hand in the office.

Treasurer Office Hours

The Treasurer will be in the office during July, August and September to accept payments on most Tuesdays from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM or by appointment.

The Treasurer will also be in the office from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM on September 14, 2017, the day summer taxes or summer deferments are due.

Deferment of Summer Taxes

Applications for Deferment of Summer Taxes-Household income must not exceed \$40,000, be 62 years of age or older including surviving spouse of person who was 62 years of age or older at the time of death; Paraplegic, Quadriplegic; Eligible Serviceperson, Eligible Veteran, Eligible Widow or Widower; Blind Person; or Totally and Permanently Disabled. Form (available at the township office) must be filed by September 14th 2017.
